- E. San Diego City Council Todd Gloria, District 3 (Adrian Granda)

Adrian Granda reported that twinkle lights and PBID projects are underway. City Council 7-2 on water rate hikes – should have been implemented long ago, and would have only gotten worse with time. 16% increase in next year with 6 to 8% increases each year for 4 years after that. Not compounding – overall 36% increase. Not currently in compliance with coastal regulations – not taking action would have a negative impact on the City's credit rating and ability to meet infrastructure needs. One Sheet is available with detailed explanation of rate increases and timeline.

Mini park is approved in long-range plan. Woolworths and other redevelopment has been returned to the City to be developed.

- F. **City of San Diego** (Elizabeth Studebaker)
 - 1. Elizabeth Studebaker reported that in Committee on October 22 regarding changes to the Storefront Improvement Projects
 - i. Increasing 12 to 25 employee limit
 - ii. Reimbursement amount and percentage of 1/3 of costs up to 5,000
 - iii. Increased to half of costs up to 8,000
 - iv. Eliminated the public art incentive because it was very restrictive and was too narrowly-defined by the standards of the art commission. Still encouraged to include public art in the project it will not have to be included in the
 - v. Design phase to permitting: with architects the City provides DSD and permitting process is holding them up will reimburse up to 5,000 or half to allow architects to help with permitting so that business owners will not get delayed
 - Angela Landsberg requested additional resources to promote the programs
 - Garrick Oliver says that a one-sheet with a step-by-step and who to call would be very helpful for the designers and architects as well as business owners Hoping to have approved by Council in January / February – presented in December
 - 2. Small Business Preparedness for El Nino Where to get supplies, how to protect your electronics, etc. resources are being made available

G. North Park Planning Committee (Steve Codraro)

Steve Codraro reported that the North Park Planning Committee is occupied full time on going element by element through the Community Plan Update. Have been meeting in small subcommittee groups to cover the entire draft

The community plan is update once every 30-40 years and is one of the primary planning tools for all types of development in communities. Community plan reflects and implements the City's General Plan. It is what, where and how you can use land. Comment period ends December 1

H. Maintenance Assessment District (Jillian Wolter)

Jillian Wolter reported that the MAD is working toward approving the Twinkle Light / tree lighting project — expect to see lights up around February 2016. North Park Main Street has concerns about the budget currently proposed by FY16 as there are upwards of \$200,000 of unallocated funds which should be spent on providing services to the district. If you would like to voice concerns about the budget, please come to the MAD Meetings, second Monday of the month at 6pm at the North Park Adult Center.

I. North Park Farmers' Market (Catt White)

Catt White reported that the market has been busy in October, 12 or 13% increase in income. New layout is very successful so far – moved the produce onto Herman Avenue and integrated different types of vendors. Cookbook exchange and Chef Demos – Waypoint and Ritual. Keeping the street activated. Closed on Thanksgiving, New Years Eve and Christmas Eve
